

O About Submission of Abstracts

Professionals from different backgrounds that support medical care are welcome to attend this meeting.

After submission, the meeting organizers may request a change in category for general abstracts in order to better position abstracts as more scientific or as useful for local actions.

Please note that the meeting organizers may not be able to accept all submissions and that abstract formats (oral or poster presentation) may need to be changed depending on meeting venue requirements.

The Hiranohara Award, Chair's Award, and Local Care Network Prize are selected from among general abstracts.

Your active submission is required.

- * Only those abstracts selected as candidates will be eligible for the Hiranohara Award.
- * Both general abstracts (Japanese) and International Session abstracts (English) can be prepared for the meeting (International Session abstracts are eligible for consideration for the Hiranohara Award.)

Qualifications for Presentation

Presenters do not have to be a member of the Japan Primary Care Association. However, the lead author must be a member in order for abstracts to be considered.

We have invited Prof. Shunichi Fukuhara (Department of Healthcare Epidemiology, Graduate School of Medicine Kyoto University / Vice-President at the Fukushima Medical University School of Medicine), the Vice Chair of the Research Support Committee and advisor to this year's meeting, in order to offer the aBus service, which was popular with attendees at the 2nd and 3rd meetings, at this year's 5th Meeting.



What is aBus?

As aBus supporters, experts in clinical research provide recommendations and offer online advice to presenters before the submission of abstracts. Attendees that wish to submit abstracts will be able to develop more scientific and complete abstracts with the advice provided through the aBus service. Please note that neither aBus supporters nor providers of the aBus service take responsibility for an abstract's final content or referee recommendations.

This system is one that is useful, effective and puts little psychological pressure on attendees that wish to present at this meeting. By making use of the aBus service, the review committee will also be able to better understand the abstract's main points. In principle, the meeting organizers recommend that submitters utilize this service. However, there are no penalties for submitters who chose not to make use of aBus service; attendees may directly submit abstracts without using this service.

Please note that aBus service is limited to clinical research, and is not available for basic research and case reports.
